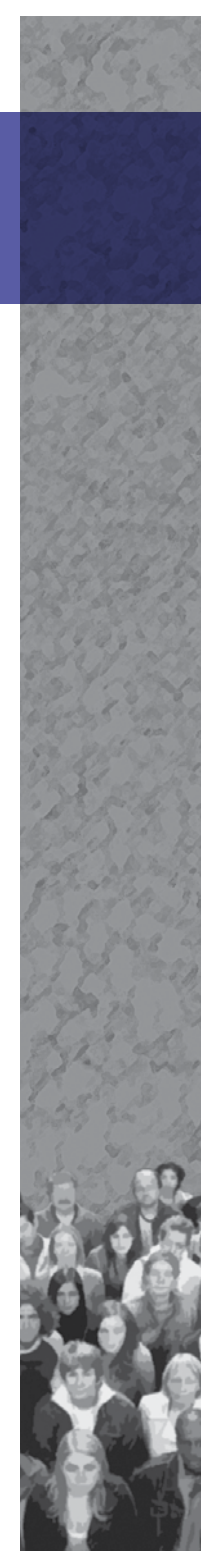

Keynote Speakers

Alexander Y. Walley, MD, MSc

Dr. Walley is a general internist and addiction medicine specialist at Boston Medical Center, and program director of the Addiction Medicine Fellowship program at Boston University. He provides primary care and office-based buprenorphine treatment for HIV patients and methadone maintenance treatment at regional centers. His research interests include medical complications of substance use, specifically HIV and overdose.

Dr. Walley is also medical director for the Opioid Overdose Prevention Pilot Program at the Massachusetts Department of Public Health. This program has trained over 30,000 people including active users, people in recovery, and their social networks. He serves as medical director for several Massachusetts police and fire department naloxone rescue programs.



Traci C. Green, PhD, MSc

Dr. Green is an epidemiologist whose research focuses on drug abuse, addiction and injury, including HIV infection and drug abuse, non-medical prescription drug use, corrections health, drug policy, and opioid overdose prevention and intervention. Supporters of her research include the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the National Institute on Drug Abuse.

She helped design the ASI-MV®, a real-time illicit and prescription drug abuse surveillance system and co-founded *prescribetoprevent.org*. She chairs the Rhode Island Drug Overdose Prevention and Rescue Coalition for the Rhode Island Department of Health.
